Thank you for your request for environmental information. We appreciate your interest, and we want to let you know that your request has been carefully considered in accordance with the Environmental Information Regulations (EIR).

For context, United Utilities is not a statutory consultee in the planning application process, however, our planning team proactively reviews local authority websites to identify planning applications that may impact UU assets and/or services.

Where risk is identified, planning applications are reviewed by the relevant UU expert to assess the risk to UU's assets and/or services and to provide advice on how to mitigate the risk through the planning application process. Based on this, UU's planning team prepares a formal response letter which is sent to the local planning authority for its consideration as part of the determination of the planning application. Where necessary, UU may require that additional information is submitted to address the risk which has been identified and/or may request that conditions are attached to any subsequent Decision Notice, should the local authority decide that the planning application can be approved.

The local authority is ultimately the decision maker for planning applications, and it does not have to reflect UU's comments or recommended conditions in its determinations. In line with this approach, UU does not send its planning responses directly to housing developers, these are instead made available by the local authority. A copy of the relevant UU planning responses to the local authority can be found in Appendix 2.

Please see attached a document titled 'Appendix 3', which details the investigations completed between 21<sup>st</sup> January 2025 and 11<sup>th</sup> February 2025 in relation to the manhole cover and siltation / debris which was present in the chamber. Pictures from this inspection are available in 'Appendix 4'. A copy of the letter which was sent to residents is also available in 'Appendix 5'. Please note that some redactions have been made in line with Regulation 13 of the EIR, and UK GDPR to remove any personal information such as names and addresses.

## Response regarding the capacity of the sewer network in the area

For awareness, it is understood that suffered suffered flooding on New Years Day due to the extreme levels of rainfall and surface water suffered in a relatively short period, and that this was mostly contained to the highway, which falls under the responsibility of the local authority. Where flooding is not as a result of our assets, or is surface water related, it is the lead local flood authority who would carry out any of the relevant investigations or ask for support from UU on anything pertaining to our network. Having liaised with our local Wastewater Team, I can confirm that Stockport MBC did not raise this event with us to investigate further.

Having liaised with our local Wastewater Team, I can also confirm that we have not had any reports of sewer flooding in the area related to the capacity of the sewers and our modelling confirms the sewers are in line with typical design standards. The issue reported to us by Stockport MBC regarding the manhole cover and silt / debris within the sewer was investigated and rectified quickly by UU. The findings of this investigation also confirmed that there were no capacity issues with the sewer, but rather a temporary blockage.
